Upstate AHEC is pleased to partner with SC DHEC, the SC Cancer Alliance and the Palliative Care Program at the Medical University of South Carolina to provide this program.

ELNEC is an acronym that stands for End-of-Life Nursing Education Consortium. The course provides nurses with education in palliative care preparing them to teach the information to practicing nurses and other healthcare professionals. The ELNEC content is divided into modules. Each module is accompanied by objectives, outline, PowerPoint slides, talking points for each slide, references, case studies, and supplemental teaching materials. The modules include: Palliative Nursing Care at the End of Life; Pain Management; Symptom Management; Communication; Final Hours; Loss, Grief & Bereavement; Leadership; and Self Care. Cultural Considerations and Ethical Issues are incorporated into the other modules.









Who should attend?

Members of the interdisciplinary team are welcome to attend a national ELNEC train-the-trainer course. Interdisciplinary palliative care is essential and having other members of the healthcare team attend ELNEC enriches the experience. However, please note that ELNEC is written by nurses for nurses and the primary goal of ELNEC is to educate nurses providing palliative care and improving end of life care.

Learning Outcomes:

At the conclusion of this program, participants will be able to -

- Describe the role of the nurse in providing quality palliative care for patients across the lifespan.
- List components of a thorough pain assessment.
- Describe pharmacological and nonpharmacological therapies used to relieve pain.
- Perform opioid conversion and verbalize components of a pain assessment
- Identify common symptoms associated with end-of-life processes for patients across the life span.
- Describe assessment of symptoms at the end of life.
- Describe interventions that can prevent or diminish symptoms at the end of life.
- Discuss ethical issues and dilemmas that may arise in end-of-life/palliative care.
- Identify dimensions of culture and the influence of culture and spirituality beliefs on palliative care for patients across the life span.
- Define the importance of ongoing communication with the interdisciplinary team, patient and family throughout an end-of-life process.
- Describe important factors in communicating bad news.
- Participants will be able to list 3 strategies of communication
- Distinguish between anticipatory grief, normal grief, complicated grief and disenfranchised grief.
- Verbalize an understanding of grief and loss issues as they relate to complex or traumatic circumstances.
- Participants will create one memory stone for a loved one.
- Assess physical, psychological, social, and spiritual care needs and interventions for an imminently dying patient and their family.
- Participants will review concepts of end of life care.
- Know how to implement learning materials within their institutions.
