

A PERSONAL NOTE FROM THE ALLIANCE

I want to start off by thanking our partners for their continued dedication to the South Carolina Cancer Alliance. Together over the last 16 years, we have made great strides in the fight against cancer in South Carolina. As many of you know, the results of our collective accomplishments are highlighted in the report, *Cancer in South Carolina, 20-year Trends in Incidence, Mortality, and Survival* (click here to view the report). While I am proud of all that we have accomplished, the need to formally address cancer incidence and deaths occurring in African American men became evident from this report.

This year we released the report, Cancer in African American Men in South Carolina (click here to review the report). The purpose of this report is to address the significantly high death rates facing African American men. Mortality rates in African American men remain on average 38% higher than the rates for white men over the last twenty years. Cancer incidence and mortality rates are highest among African American men in cancers of the prostate, lung, and colorectum. For stomach and prostate cancer, African American men have a mortality rate that is more than 150% higher than the rate for white men.

Moving forward you will notice an increase in our fundraising efforts throughout the state. The funds we raise will be used to support interventions that will increase the screening rates in African American men. The Alliance will continue our various outreach efforts to improve the health of ALL South Carolinians, but this additional effort will be geared to improve the health of African American men.

I sincerely hope you will consider donating to our mission. Your gift will reduce the impact of cancer in South Carolina.

BREAST CANCER

The Breast Cancer work group is pleased to announce that Jennifer Massey will be serving as the cochair of the workgroup alongside Dr. Trenessa Jones. Members of the workgroup are working to determine which health care providers currently provide health equity training, and how those practices can be implemented. The workgroup members also committed to ensure that they will get at least two women each who have never been screened for breast cancer to receive a mammogram in the next two months.

HPV VACCINATION

The cervical cancer workgroup continues to promote the social media campaign, HPV Vaccination NOW: This is Our Moment. Researchers at the College of Charleston have 22 participants enrolled in the HPV Vaccination Influencers project. The project will be wrapping up before the holidays and the posttest survey will be disseminated on December 16th.

Lastly, the Alliance awarded one mini-grant to Fairfield Medical Association to increase their HPV vaccination rates.

POLICY AND ADVOCACY

On Dec. 5 the Alliance hosted our annual Blue Granite Day at the Capital City Club in Columbia. This event was sponsored by Bristol Myers Squibb Pharmaceuticals. Over 30 individuals attended the event and we continued our conversation on how to improve the health of African American Men in South Carolina. The Alliance will use the information from this meeting to create an action plan that will begin to address the disparities listed in the report, *Cancer in African American Men in South Carolina*. PROSTATE CANCER

The Prostate Cancer Workgroup is working on its evaluation from the September 2019 Prostate Health Workshop in Hartsville, SC.
